




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This week in Reception we have enjoyed continuing our learning about the story 'Look up'. We have been learning all about numbers 6, 7 and 8 in maths. In curriculum, the children

have done an excellent job of naming and ordering the planets in the solar system. In Nursery, we have enjoyed ordering the story of Whatever Next! We have also enjoyed finding out more about the different planets in our solar system.





This week in Year 1 the children have been working hard in English and have been writing a report all about Northern Ireland

which links to their geography learning. The children have been learning how to estimate numbers on a number line and have been comparing numbers using greater than, less than and equal to. The children have also been enjoying computing, where they have been learning to edit photographs.

This week in Year 2 we have had another busy week, we began to look at our new text "Timeless Thomas" which is a biography about the life of Thomas Edison who was a famous



inventor. The children have enjoyed learning all about biographies and some of the amazing inventions Thomas Edison invented, many of which have evolved into devices we use today. During our maths sessions we have continued to learn about shapes and looked at sorting 3D shapes and using shapes to create patterns. In geography we have been learning about The British Isles and this week we focused on Wales, identifying urban and rural parts of Wales and learning about Mount Snowdon, even taking a trip to look at the view from the top on google earth. PSHE this week has looked at how we work together in a team, the children had to work in small groups and were able to discuss what they found easy and what they found difficult about working with others. We had lots of fun in our science session creating circuits to make the bulbs light up and then testing other devices such as buzzers and switches. The children are also impressing us with their times tables knowledge, keep practising on Times Tables Rockstars! Another super week in Year 2, well done everyone.



We have been working hard again this week in Year 3/4. In English, we've been creating a non-chronological report based on our own dragon linked to our class novels. In our report, we included high level vocabulary and

tried to vary our sentences with the use of different conjunctions. In science, we explored how concave and convex mirrors altered reflections. We had such a fun time investigating this!

This week has been a busy week, Year 5 have been consolidating their problemsolving skills in maths and finishing their formal letters in



English. In music, the focus this half term has been 'Blues'. This week, the children have enjoyed learning how to play the 12 bar blues. The Year 6 children have been preparing themselves for the upcoming SATs with a week of practice SATs. They have all given their all and put their absolute best into it and the scores they are getting are improving every time. Their effort and determination is really paying off! Well done Year 6!

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#### **School Procedures for Absentees**

#### First Day of Absence

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

#### Parents' Legal Responsibilities

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.


These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.

#### **West Road Spelling Bee Competition**

Dear Parent/Carer.

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
