This week in Reception we have been learning about length, height and time in maths. In English, we are reading Jack and the Beanstalk

and have enjoyed planting our own seeds. In Nursery, we have been reading the story of Jaspers Beanstalk. The children have been learning about length and height and creating their own beanstalks.





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This week Year 1 have been working hard on their new units of learning. In English we have started reading our new book "window". In maths we have been looking at addition and subtraction and started learning our number bond

facts within 20. In science we have spoken about how we can care for the Earth and different ways humans don't care for the Earth and the impact this has on animals and the environment.

We have had a great first week back in Year 2. We have started to read our new text "The Maid, The Witch and the Cruel Queen" which links with our history component for this half term "The Tudors". The children enjoyed predicting



what the text will be about and then reading the first chapter. In history we looked at a timeline to find out when the Tudors lived and started to learn about what the Tudors were like and how they lived. During our art session we learnt all about landscapes and seascapes and then painted the background for our own seascape using sponges, we think they look fantastic. In maths we have been looking at word problems related to money and following the steps to help us to solve them. Science this term is learning all about plants, we looked at different leaves and plants and talked about how they were the same and different. Please encourage your children to use Times Tables Rockstars and EdShed at home

as these really help to support their learning in school. A super first week back, well done Year 2.



Welcome back to Spring 2! This week in Year 3-4, we have started our history component based on the Anglo-Saxons, Scots & Vikings. We

have looked at the early settlers in Scotland who were the Picts and Scots. In English, we have been consolidating our learning around light by writing an explanation text linked to this. This week we have also started our dance unit with our instructor, Sadie.

UKS2 have had an amazing first week back. We have started our new component in science where we are learning all about forces and mechanisms. We are also continuing our learning about the Victorian times



when Queen Victoria ruled England. Some of the Year 5s have been on their first swimming lesson and everyone thoroughly enjoy it! Some of the Year 6s represented West Road in a bench ball tournament at Trinity and they won every game!! We are all really proud of them!

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#### **School Procedures for Absentees**

#### First Day of Absence

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

#### Parents' Legal Responsibilities

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.

These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.
