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In Nursery, we have been learning about animals and their babies and if all babies look like their parents. We have also been learning about weight and what things in our

classroom are heavy or light. We are very excited in Nursery as our bean plants have started to grow! In Reception, we have been reading the

story of The Enormous Turnip and measuring our plants. In maths we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes and sorting them.



This week Year 1 have been learning about medicine safety in PSHE. They have spoken about who can give them medicines and where

medicines should be stored safely. In history, the children have learnt about King Charles I and how he did not want to listen to parliament about taxing people.





This week in Year 2 we have been completing our work on the text "Tudor Tales" and writing a diary entry. During our maths sessions we have looked at division, doubling and halving and how

this relates to multiplication. In history we have continued to learn about the Tudors, learning all about how Mary I became queen. Art this week has involved us looking at artists who have used symmetry in their art and had a go at drawing some of the pictures in different ways. In science

we have started an investigation to find out what plants need to grow, we are looking forward to seeing which of our plants grow the best. We were very proud that all of year 2 achieved 100% attendance last week and we enjoyed our reward of a non-uniform day on Thursday.

Another super week Year 2, keep up the super work.



Another busy week has been had in Year 3/4! In science, we have studied the process of pollination and how insects

help with this process. It was interesting to discover that pollen sticks to insects and they transfer the pollen from one plant to another. The Year 4 children have been completing their assessments this week and Mr Deere, Miss Richardson and Miss Brown are proud of how hard they have worked. This week in dance, the children have looked at jazz style of dancing. Ask them to give you a little demonstration.

This week in UKS2 we have enjoyed developing our skills in PE where we have been learning the rules of basketball



and perfecting our dribble technique. In science we have been designing and investigating parachutes with different materials to see which has the most air resistance. We have continued our class novel in English and we are writing our own narrative. We are doing a fantastic job preparing for our next assessments and SATS and the staff are very proud of the hard work they are all applying to each lesson. Well done.

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School Procedures for Absentees

First Day of Absence

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

Parents' Legal Responsibilities

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.


These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.
