In Nursery this week we have been learning about how we have changed since being babies and what we can do now. We have been looking at The

Enormous Turnip and putting the story in order.

In Reception, we have been looking at the story of We're going on an Easter egg hunt. In maths we have been doing doubles and making ten. We have had a lovely week, Well Done EYFS!!





This week Year 1 have been working hard on their phonics skills and maths skills in their apply sessions where they have revised

various phonemes and worked on their addition skills. In PSHE, the children discussed the various ways they can keep their bodies safe and healthy. The children have also finished the RE component on sacred times by creating a storyboard to show the Easter story. They showed a good understanding of why we celebrate Good Friday and Easter Sunday and how a sad time turns into a happy, special time.





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This week in Year 2 we have worked hard to produce our non-chronological reports all about Henry VIII, the

children have impressed us with their knowledge and everything they have remembered about King Henry VIII, his wives and his reign. In maths we have started to look at measuring, the children began by looking at length practising using a ruler to measure and draw lines accurately. We continued with our science experiment investigating what plants need in order to grow. We have enjoyed seeing the seeds start to germinate and grow and we were surprised to see how quickly the plants with no light have grown. During our history session we continued to learn about the Tudors and this week learnt all about Queen Elizabeth I. We looked at how she became the gueen and also compared her reign to the reign of King Henry VIII. Another super week in Year 2 and we hope you all have a lovely break.

We have had a great final week of this term in Year 3/4. In English, the children wrote a letter to Grendel, in the role of King Hrothgar, to



plead with him to stop attacking the warriors. In PSHE, we have concluded our learning about being healthy by creating an infographic to showcase what we have learned. Our dance sessions with Sadie have ended this week but we have had an amazing time working with her and learning a range of dance genres.



Another busy week in UKS2, we have been finalising our topics for the end of the term with mini assessments, essays and quizzes showing off what we have learnt throughout this

half term. In science we made and tested different size parachutes to see what effect surface area had on air resistance and the time they took to fall to the ground. We also had a visit from a Trinity science teacher who delivered a lesson about friction, it was a little taster of the lessons we will be having in year 7. Thursday will be our whole school Easter raffle, fingers crossed we will have lots of lucky winners.

Have a lovely Easter break, stay safe and we look forward to seeing everyone back and well rested.

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### **School Procedures for Absentees**

# First Day of Absence

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

# Parents' Legal Responsibilities

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.


These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.
