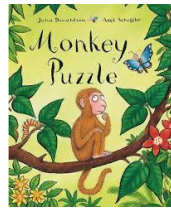

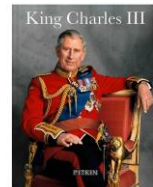

Nursery have started reading a new story 'Monkey Puzzle.' They have been describing the animals they have read about. In maths, they have been counting out four objects. In Reception, the pupils have

learnt all about King Charles III. They have looked at his Royal cypher on post boxes. We had a visit from PCSO Ben and PCSO Darren who taught the Reception pupils all about keeping themselves safe. They talked about their jobs and pupils enjoyed asking questions. In maths, Reception have been making AAB and ABB repeating patterns. Excellent work Early Years!



## Seven Continents



This week Year 1 have enjoyed starting their new geography unit all about the seven continents of the world. They were able to locate the continents on a world map. In science, the children planted cress seeds in order to observe what the best conditions were for plants to grow. In maths, the children started learning about length and height and learnt how to measure objects using a ruler in centimetres.



We have had a fantastic start back to the term. Our times tables are really coming on and there have been some big improvements on Times Tables Rockstars! We have been learning about measure in maths, looking at

how many cms within a metre and how we can calculate using this. In English, we have started our new class text which is a novel by Enid Blyton. This term we are reading The Magic Faraway Tree which everyone has been very excited about. We have taken part in a curling tournament during PE with Mr Cooke, the KS2 PE coach and learnt about how this is one of the events in the Winter Olympics.

First week back for year 3-4 and it is like they have never been away. They have shown tremendous effort and attitude moving into our Summer term. In maths, we have moved onto measurement for Year 3 and fractions for Year 4's. We have started our new book in English which is "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland" which with some of the children watching the film they have found very interesting. PE this term is also football which has gone down very well with both years with the children looking forward to showing off their skills. Keep up the good work Year 3-4.



This week, UKS2 have started lots of new learning. In history, we have learnt about the causes of World War 1. This links to our geography learning and children were able to locate different countries around the world. We have started our learning about space in science. Children learnt all about the Big Bang and what else exists in the universe. This learning will lead to a trip to the National Space Centre at the beginning of June. Children will be able to use all of their science learning to explore the museum and take part in workshops.

## Poppy Playtime

It is important that you are aware that whilst the name and characters suggest a playful game, it is a **survival horror game with graphics that may not be suitable for your child.** It includes characters such as 'Kissy Wissy' and 'Huggy Wuggy.' Please view this game before allowing your child to play it as it may not be appropriate for them – particularly young children.

Children may be playing the game or just watching videos of it on sites such as YouTube or playing replicated versions on Roblox for example.

## Cyberbullying

### What is cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying is bullying online and can take many forms such as sending malicious messages, leaving nasty comments, excluding somebody from a group chat, blackmailing or setting up a fake profile. Cyberbullying can take place across many different platforms such as WhatsApp, Snapchat and on games such as Roblox and Minecraft.



### What should I do if my child is being bullied online?

If your child is being bullied, then try to stay calm and let them know that it is not their fault. It is always useful to keep evidence of any online bullying and inform their school so that they are aware. Show your child how to block and/or report any users/content and review their privacy settings to limit what others can see. You may also wish to set up any parental controls that are available.

## Group Chats

Group Chats are available on various messaging apps, social media apps and in some games. When your child is part of these groups, they may not know all the other members and it may even include people that they have previously blocked. Your child may come across inappropriate content and bullying can take place within these groups. Talk to your child about how they speak to others online and encourage them to talk to people online with kindness, like they would if they were face-to-face. 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**You must be over 13 years of age to use TikTok.**

TikTok is a social media platform for sharing and watching short video clips. Some of the videos may not be appropriate for your child to view and there is also the risk of strangers contacting your child. If your child is using TikTok then make sure appropriate security/privacy settings are applied.

**Account set up**

As always, it is important that when setting up an account, your child enters their real date of birth as accounts are tailored by age e.g., direct Messaging is disabled for accounts aged 13-15. In addition, advertisements are tailored to their age. By default, accounts for people under 16 are set to private and we would recommend keeping it as this. This means your child must approve follower requests. You can read more about the other settings available, such as switching off comments and switching on restricted mode here: <https://support.tiktok.com/en/account-and-privacy/account-privacy-settings>.

**Family Pairing**

This allows you to link your own account to your child's account. You can then set controls such as restricted mode. You can find out more here: <https://www.tiktok.com/safety/en/guardians-guide/>

**Inappropriate content, themes and challenges on TikTok**

Whilst against TikTok's guidelines, explicit and inappropriate content can be found on this platform, for example nudity/sexual content and hate speech. We often see viral challenges on social media, some of which can be dangerous. If your child is using TikTok, chat to them regularly about what they are viewing.

**Trends and Influencers**

We often see trends on social media, for example a latest trend found is around skin care routines, which can lead to children purchasing products that are completely unsuitable/dangerous for their skin. Influencers are people who have a large following on social media who through recommendations and promotions, influence the behavior or buying habits of others. **Stranger contact**

Talk to your child about who is following them online and ensure that they understand that people may not be who they say they are when online. It is important that children know not to share personal information.

**Blocking and Reporting**

Ensure your child knows how to use the safety features available to them, including how to report comments, direct messages and another user.

## **School Procedures for Absentees**

### **First Day of Absence**

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

### **Parents' Legal Responsibilities**

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.

These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.


