In Nursery we have been learning about the Arctic and Antarctic and the animals that live there and how they



keep warm. In maths, we have been looking at the number 6 and practicing counting to 6. We had lots of fun on our animal dress up day making lots of animal crafts. We have had a lovely week in Nursery, Well done everyone!!







This week, Reception pupils have come dressed as royalty as part of the Kings and Queens day. They thoroughly enjoyed making crowns and Royal

artwork inspired by the artist Steven Brown. In maths, pupils have been solving addition and subtraction problems. Well done Reception for a fantastic week!

This week Year 1 have been using their science knowledge of plants to plan and write a nonchronological report about a sunflower. The children have started



learning about Islam and what Muslims believe. In art, the children used their knowledge about myths to draw a knight from the myth 'George and the Dragon'. In science, the children learnt about plants we can eat and what part of the plant they come from. We also spoke about how some plants are poisonous and inedible.



Year 2 have had a brilliant week. In English, we have written our own stories based on Enid Blyton. We have also been revising some of our SPAG content and developing our reading comprehension skills. We are currently trying

to extend the amount of time children can sustain reading for. Please try and practise this skill at home. Let your child read for 10-15 minutes at a time and ask them what they have been reading about. This will prepare them for entering KS2 in the Autumn. We have tested different structures for strength in DT, using plasticine and have been thinking about who our safe adults are in school during PSHE. In maths, we have been practising fractions of amounts.

Year 3-4 have been working incredibly hard again this week and all the staff are super proud. In English, the children have finished their final piece of writing on



floods and can now tell us all the important facts and top tips to stay safe. In maths both year groups have been continuing their hard work ready for their tests coming up in Summer 2. Across all other areas the children have been fantastic and very mature in a very busy week at West Road.



This week we have been so impressed with how well our Year 6 children have worked on their SATS tests! They deserve lots of treats and huge congratulations for their efforts. Year 5 have been

extremely supportive to Year 6 at this time and have still been working hard with Mrs Robson, Mrs Berry and Mrs Linley-Jones. We ended our long week with a comfy film day and lots of PE to burn some of our energy and help to calm our minds!

School Procedures for Absentees

First Day of Absence

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

Parents' Legal Responsibilities

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.

These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.
